Scholarship Guidelines

Purpose of Scholarship

The primary objective of the scholarship fund is to provide the necessary funding for Mayors and/or Council members in SRLC to attend and receive the value of education and training offered through the Institute of Elected Municipal Officials (IEMO). Specifically, it is designed to provide an opportunity for Mayors and/or Council Members that otherwise would not be able to attend due to fiscal limitations of their city. This scholarship fund will pay for up to two scholarships each year, with the goal of increasing the amount of scholarships in future years as funds allow.

IEMOs provide elected municipal officials with an intensive and proven academic program that will assist them in effectively meeting the requirements of their elected role. The program offers a comprehensive overview of Florida municipal government, presented by a faculty of top professionals in the field. IEMOs are held three times a year, usually in a northern, central and southern location. The Institute of Government (IOG) and the Florida League of Cities (FLC) select the dates and sites at least 2-3 months prior to January each year.

<u>Criteria</u>

The following criteria will be used to evaluate applications for the scholarships:

- 1. Applicant must be an elected official of a member city in the Suwannee River region.
- 2. Applicant has requested funding from municipality and has been denied full funding.
- 3. Member city must send a letter to the SRLC stating need and confirming the interest of the person who seeks the scholarship.
- 4. If applicant is not attending the nearest location, a written justification/explanation about why must be provided.
- 5. Member city must agree to make travel and lodging arrangements to enable these expenses to be tax free.
- 6. Written evidence that municipality supports attendance at the IEMO must be provided.
- 7. Recipient agrees to give an update to his/her city upon completion of the course and will be a spokesperson for the program within SRLC.
- 8. Applicant must be in good standing with the SRLC and FLC including being a municipal member of both and not under any type of formal ethical or criminal complaint.
- 9. Applications must be received no later than 1 month prior to the IEMO.

Selection Process

The President of the SRLC shall appoint annually, from the SRLC Board of Directors, a three (3) person committee to serve as the Scholarship Review Committee. The purpose of the Committee is to review, evaluate and make recommendations to the full Board of Directors for approval of scholarships. The only parameters for evaluating the merits of each scholarship application are the existing criteria developed and approved by the Board. Upon request of the Board, the SRLC Board of Directors may also review the criteria for the scholarships with proposed changes to the criteria requiring full approval of the Board.

Scholarship Expenses

The current registration fee for the IEMO is \$275 per person. A three night hotel stay, if not located within driving distance, is required (Thursday to Sunday hotel stay; classes run Friday 8 am to Sunday 3:30 pm). Hotel costs range from \$90 to \$129 a night, depending upon location. The conference fee covers a modest continental breakfast and breaks daily plus two lunches. One lunch and dinners for the 3 days will be on his/her own.

The Scholarship will only pay for the expenses associated with the IEMO registration fee, travel, lodging, meals and other reasonable direct expenses under the per diem policies of the SRLC, which may include tips and portage. Each scholarship applicant will be required to incur the upfront costs and then submit necessary receipts and be reimbursed according to the SRLC reimbursement policy.

If there are any discrepancies on what is a reasonable or allowable expense, scholarship recipients should first check with SRLC staff to obtain guidance. If an expense is claimed and there is a discrepancy, the matter will be brought before the full Board of Directors for a final decision.
